



Pathway to Supported Workskills – Supported Workskills

Overview

The Pathway to Supported Workskills – Supported Workskills is designed for individuals who would benefit from learning and further developing the skills that will prepare them for their future and adult life, specifically work. It is designed around the Preparation for Adulthood Agenda and will take 1–2 years to complete.

This pathway is suitable for individuals who are ready to undertake a supported work placement outside of the college.

English and maths is delivered to all individuals on the pathway through mixed delivery of discrete sessions and through embedded activities.

Some individuals will work towards an accredited English and Maths Functional Skills qualification from Entry Level 1.

What will be studied

Setting and meeting work-related targets

Time management

Searching for a job

Conduct at work

Working in a team

Health and safety in the workplace

How will individuals be assessed?

Most individuals will undertake an accredited qualification: Gateway Certificate in Employability Skills.

Individuals will also be assessed both in the classroom and throughout their work placement.

Some individuals will be assessed by an external assessment for English and maths.

What can individuals do after?

Individuals may progress onto other supported programmes within Bloom. Others may move onto higher level qualifications at any of the college campuses.

Some individuals may wish to be supported out of education, for example, to access a social care provision or employment through a Supported Internship.
