Why did you choose to study at The Sheffield College?

I have previously studied higher education in another country, but I felt I needed to study GCSE Maths & English at The Sheffield College to reboot my potentials before pursuing further studies here in the UK. GCSE's were a starting point.

What facilities have you enjoyed using or found particularly useful during your course?

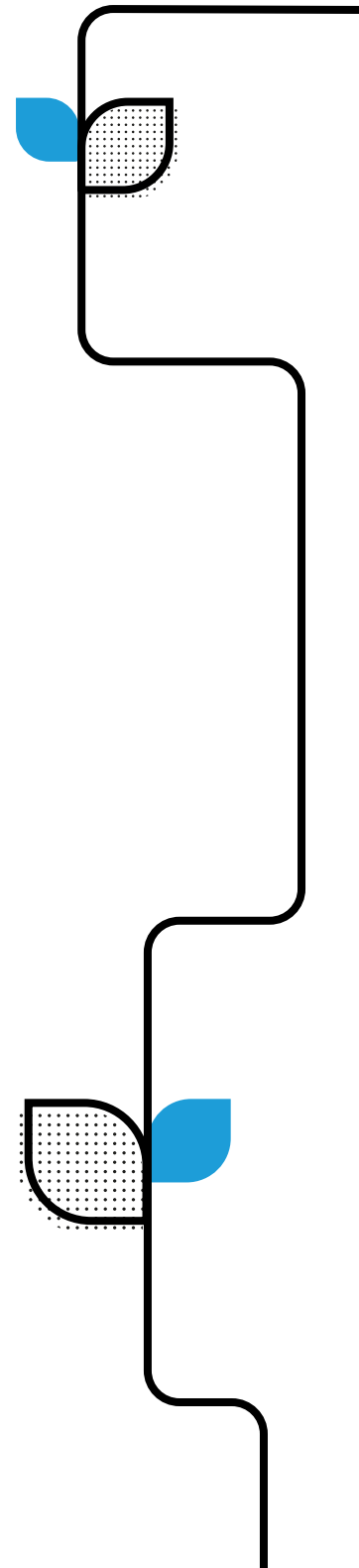

Why did you choose to study at The Sheffield College?

What facilities have you enjoyed using or found particularly useful during your course?

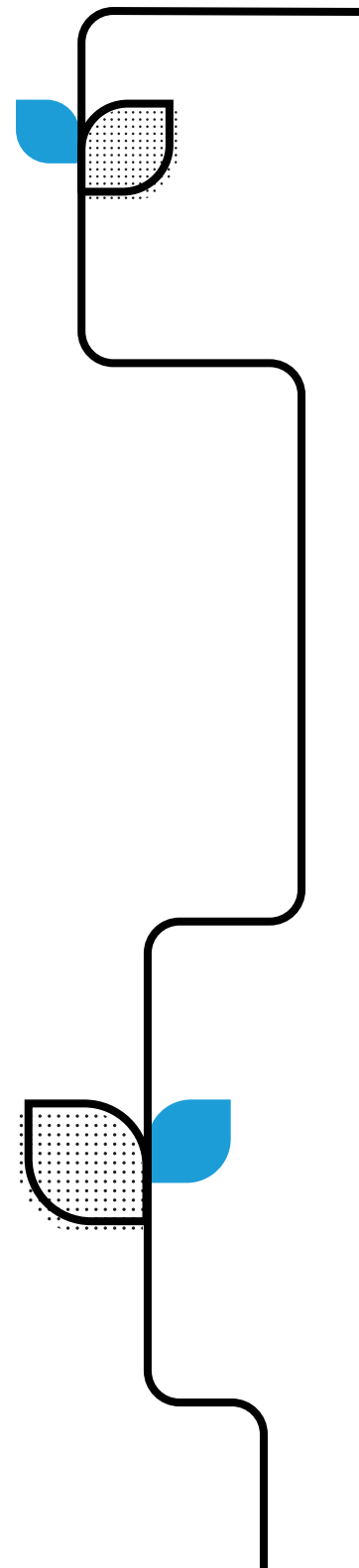
All of the sessions have been recorded and shared with us. I thought this was great because I could refer to them at any time whenever I needed to or, if I missed a session.
